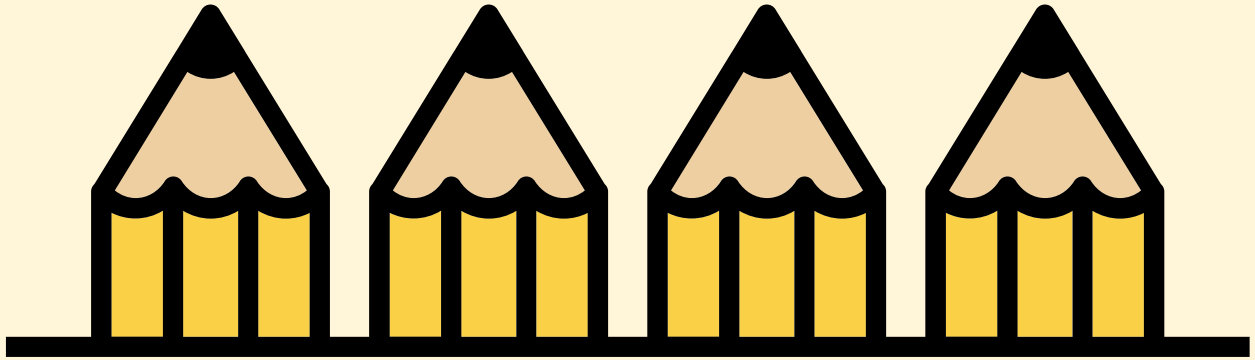
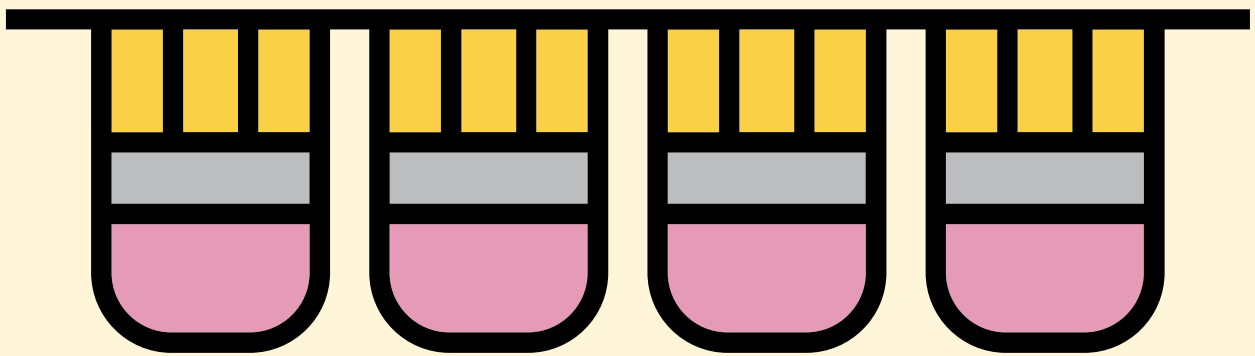

Capitalization/Punctuation

Every sentence must begin with a capital letter and end with a punctuation mark.

Rule #1

A declarative statement ends with a period.



I can use capitalization and punctuation.

Every sentence must begin with a capital letter. A declarative sentence makes a statement and ends with a period.

Examples:

- The dog is fluffy.
- William can dance.
- A bunny hopped by.

Rule #2

An interrogative sentence ends with a question mark.



I can use capitalization and punctuation.

Every sentence must begin with a capital letter.

An interrogative sentence asks a question and ends with a question mark.

Examples:

- Can you come to my house?
- What is his name?
- When is the trip?

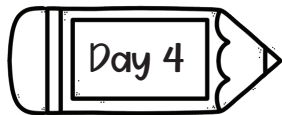

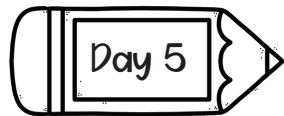

Capitalization/Punctuation

Every sentence must begin with a capital letter and end with a punctuation mark.

Rule #3

An exclamatory sentence ends with an exclamation point.



I can use capitalization and punctuation.

Every sentence must begin with a capital letter.

An exclamatory sentence shows strong emotion or excitement and ends with an exclamation point.

Examples:

- You did a great job!
- That dog is huge!
- What a terrible mess!
